

Call for Proposals

You are invited to submit a proposal to the 2017 International Summit on Suicide Research of the International Academy for Suicide Research and the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention to be held at Green Valley Ranch Resort from November 5-8, 2017.

The Program Committee is especially interested in proposals on the topics of:

- Clinical and neurocognitive studies of suicidal behavior
- Genetic, epigenetic, and gene expression contributors to suicide risk
- Neurobiological underpinnings of suicidal behavior
- Novel monitoring strategies for detecting changes in risk over time
- Interventions, outcomes, and services research on suicide prevention
- Study of integrated approaches to suicide prevention
- Culturally specific approaches: factors and solutions
- New technology and applications for suicide prevention
- Methodologic issues in public health and population-based studies of suicide prevention
- Ethical and methodological challenges and solutions in suicide research

2017 Submission Categories and Deadlines:

Oral Presentations:

- Single research presentations lasting 10 minutes with 5 minutes for Q&A and discussion.
- Research reports will be grouped into sessions based on similar topics.
- Each submitter will be asked to submit at least 1 learning objective for their talk for consideration.
- DEADLINE TO SUBMIT: MAY 17, 2017

Posters:

- Abstract for poster presentation.
- All posters will be on display during all poster sessions, however each presenter will be assigned one session for presentation. Presenters should make their travel plans accordingly.
- DEADLINE TO SUBMIT: MAY 17, 2017

Symposia Proposals:

- Symposia sessions should include a chair and 4 speakers.
- The chair of the session can be one of the speakers.
- Each session is 1 hour and 30 minutes long.
- Each speaker will have approximately 15 minutes to speak to allow time for discussion and questions.
- The chair of the session will be asked to submit at least 2 learning objectives for the session.
- DEADLINE TO SUBMIT: MARCH 14, 2017

All suicide researchers and those interested in learning about the most cutting edge evidence are invited to attend and take advantage of this excellent opportunity to network and interact. In addition to plenary sessions with preeminent suicide researchers and symposia, the meeting will include a mentoring program, poster sessions, oral presentations and workshops addressing methodological issues particular to suicide research, such as assessment of suicidal behavior, strategies for research on low base rate outcomes, use of proxy measures, and maintaining the delicate balance between ethical and methodological concerns.
