Dr. Michal Lipinski is a neuroscientist and postdoctoral researcher in the laboratory of Professor Paola Arlotta at Harvard University and the Broad Institute of MIT and Harvard. Comprehensively trained in gene regulation, epigenetics, and single-cell biology, he currently studies bipolar disorders and their treatments using patient-derived induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSC) and brain organoids.

Michal received his B.Sc. and M.Sc. in biotechnology from Warsaw Life Science University in Poland. He subsequently moved to Alicante, Spain, where he received his M.Sc. and Ph.D. in neuroscience from University of Miguel Hernandez of Elche at the Institute of Neurosciences. He received the prize for "Extraordinary PhD Dissertation" from his alma mater for his work on CBP and p300 regulation of neuronal identity maintenance.
