ABOUT THE AWARD

The Paul Wender Best Paper Award honors an author whose work has made a significant contribution to clinical psychopharmacology, published in *The Journal of Clinical Psychiatry* within the past year. The recipient will receive a **\$1,000 stipend upon mandatory** attendance at the **2026 ASCP Annual Meeting**.

This award celebrates the legacy of Paul H. Wender, MD (1934–2019), widely regarded as the "Dean of ADHD." Dr. Wender pioneered the identification and treatment of ADHD across the lifespan, advancing research on its genetic and neurobiological origins, and authoring seminal works including The Hyperactive Child (1974) and ADHD in Children and Adults (2000).

- ✓ Papers published in *The Journal of Clinical Psychiatry* from January 2025 Present
- Must be original reports or meta-analyses on patient-relevant research in clinical psychopharmacology
- ▼ The top five downloaded papers from 2025 will automatically be considered
