Call for Proposals

You are invited to submit a proposal to the 2021 International Summit on Suicide Research of the International Academy for Suicide Research and the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention to be held at the World Trade Center Barcelona, Spain from October 24-27, 2021.

This meeting will bring together suicide researchers studying topics ranging from neurobiology, epidemiology and genetics to assessment, intervention and prevention. All suicide researchers and those interested in learning about the most cutting-edge evidence are invited to attend and take advantage of this excellent opportunity to network and interact. In addition to plenary sessions with preeminent suicide researchers and symposia, the meeting will include a mentoring program, poster sessions, and workshops addressing methodological issues particular to suicide research. Workshops will cover topics such as assessment of suicidal behavior and risk, strategies for research on low base rate outcomes, use of technology and proxy measures, approaches to facilitate inclusion of underrepresented populations, study design options that produce robust and reliable results, and guidance for the safe inclusion of individuals at high-risk for suicidal behavior.

2021 Submission Categories and Deadlines:

Symposia Proposals:

- Symposia sessions should include a chair and 4 speakers.
- The session can include a discussant if you choose.
- The chair of the session can be one of the speakers.
- Each session is 1 hour and 30 minutes long.
- Each speaker will have approximately 15 minutes to speak to allow time for discussion and questions.
- The chair of the session will be asked to submit 1 learning objective and 2 multiple choice post-post test questions for the session.
- **DEADLINE TO SUBMIT: MONDAY, MARCH 22, 2021**

Oral Presentations:

- Single research presentations lasting 10 minutes with 5 minutes for Q&A and discussion.
- Research reports will be grouped into sessions based on similar topics.
- Each submitter will be asked to submit at least 1 learning objective for their talk for consideration.
- **DEADLINE TO SUBMIT: MONDAY, MAY 31, 2021**

Posters:

- Abstract for poster presentation.
- There are two scheduled poster sessions during the Summit: One on Monday and another on Tuesday during lunch. Poster presenters must be available to present on either day as scheduling requests are not accepted.
