Excellence in Interdisciplinary Work/Research Award

This award is designed to recognize members of the MNRS Population Health Research & Implementation Interest Group. These interest group awards do not take the place of other awards given by the MNRS as an organization.

Nominations for awards open October 11th, 2024, and are due December 6th, 2024, by 5:00 PM EST via the online 2025 Annual Research Conference website: https://mnrs.societyconference.com/v2/

Notifications on decisions will be made by the RIIG Awards Committee by January 31st, 2025, prior to the MNRS 2025 annual conference. Each RIIG award winner MUST present their short presentation/acceptance during their RIIG meeting (RIIG meeting will be held either virtually prior to the conference or in-person at the conference TBD).

Purpose of the Award: The purpose of this award is to formally recognize the contributions of a RIIG member who promotes nursing science in interdisciplinary spaces and whose work/research has advanced, or has the potential to advance, population health nursing science and/or practice.

Criteria for the Award: The nominee demonstrates:

- Significant potential for leadership within interdisciplinary spaces including, but not limited to, medicine, social work, psychology, health behavior, health policy, education, economics, etc.
- Evidence of a program of research which is interdisciplinary centric, engaging with at least one other discipline, if not more, in work and/or research
- Excellent interdisciplinary work or research with high potential for translation into practice, and/or the ability to enhance nursing science or other disciplines in areas related to population health

Eligibility Requirements:

- The nominee is a member in good standing with MNRS and the Population Health RIIG
- All nominees to be considered must be active members of the RIIG for at least one year
- Applicants can only be awarded one RIIG award per year

Submission Requirements:

- Nominee's resume or Curriculum vitae
- Description of the nominee's program of research (limit 2 pages on letterhead)
- Nomination letter (limit 1 page on letterhead) from colleague describing the nominee's merit, contributions to nursing science, evidence of interdisciplinary work, and significance to the advancement of population health nursing science and/or practice. Please include the following:
 - o Nominee name, credentials (if applicable), and contact information
 - o Description of achievement in relation to the above award criteria
 - o Nominator's name, credentials, and contact information
