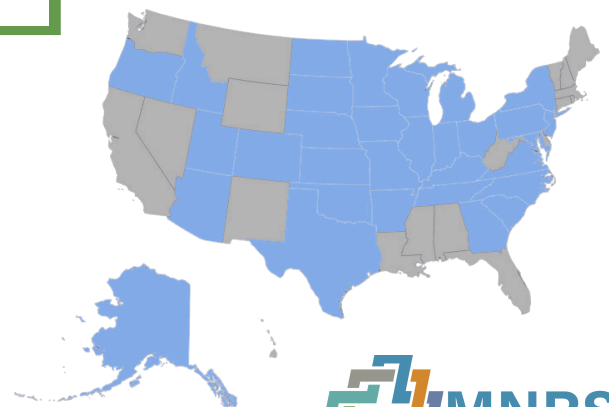

Karen Dunn-Lopez

PhD, MPH, RN FAAN

University of Iowa, College of Nursing

About

Dr. Dunn Lopez, PhD, MPH, RN, FAAN, is a leading expert in nursing informatics at The University of Iowa College of Nursing, where she is a Professor and Director of the Center for Nursing Classification and Clinical Effectiveness. She aims to improve health outcomes through user-friendly, evidence-based decision-making tools for healthcare teams.

Her research includes developing nurse-centric technologies, showcasing the value of nurses through electronic health records, and linking decision support to patient outcomes. With over 65 peer-reviewed publications and significant funding from major institutions, she is also a leader in nursing informatics, holding key roles in several professional organizations, including Chair of MNRS's Health Systems Policy and Informatics Research Group, Chair of the Nursing Informatics Working Group of the American Medical Informatics Association, Incoming Chair of the Alliance for Nursing Informatics, and North American Board Member for the Association for Common European Nursing Diagnosis, Interventions, and Outcomes.

Sarah Rossetti

About

Sarah Rossetti, RN, PhD is an Associate Professor of Biomedical Informatics and Nursing at Columbia University. Her research has been funded by NIH and AHRQ and is focused on identifying and intervening on patient risk for harm by applying computational tools to mine and extract value from EHR data and leveraging user-centered design for patient-centered technologies. She co-leads the CONCERN Early Warning System study which uses AI methods to predict patient deterioration based on nursing surveillance patterns and has been shown to significantly decrease patient mortality, sepsis, and length of stay. She is chair of AMIA's 25x5 Task Force to Reduce Documentation Burden. Dr. Rossetti is an experienced critical care nurse, received her PhD from Columbia University School of Nursing, and completed a Post-Doctoral Research Fellowship at Columbia University's Department of Biomedical Informatics. She was selected as a 2019 recipient of the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers (PECASE).
