



Paper Session - Paper Sessions are opportunities for the primary author to give an oral presentation of their completed research. A paper presentation is 12 minutes in length followed by 3 minutes Q&A.

Poster Discussion – Poster Discussions are opportunities for the primary author to give a brief 3-minute synopsis of 1-3 key findings from the study. This 90-minute session includes 30 minutes for general poster viewing and 60 minutes of moderated discussion.

20 x 20 Presentation - 20 x 20 Presentations are opportunities for the primary author to give an oral presentation using 20 slides that automatically advance every 20 seconds. The presentation is 6 minutes and 40 seconds. The session will conclude with up to 15 minutes of group discussion.

Postcard Presentation - Postcard Presentations are opportunities for the primary author to provide one electronic slide and a 5-minute brief summary highlighting the key points of the work.

Poster Session – Poster Sessions are opportunities for the primary author to present their completed or ongoing science through a poster presentation. Poster Sessions are 90 minutes during the 90 minute poster viewing session. There is no formal presentation for poster sessions.





Include the theoretical framework if applicable. <u>Project implementation</u> - Describe the implementation process and significant challenges encountered. Include plans for implementation if the project is not complete. <u>Evaluation Criteria</u> - Provide details of your method for evaluating the success of the project. Include proposed evaluation criteria if the project is not complete.

<u>Outcomes</u> - What were the outcomes of the project and how were they measured?

6 Conclusions *

<u>Recommendations</u> - Describe your recommendations for clinical practice and policy based on the outcome of the evidence-based practice project

COMPETITIVE ABSTRACT RESEARCH ABSTRACT

3 Background *

<u>Purpose and Background/Significance</u> - State the purpose of the study and why it is important to nursing science, practice and/or patient care. <u>Theoretical/Conceptual Framework</u> - Include conceptual and operational definitions.

4) Methods *

Methods - Describe the study design, sample, instruments used, and data collection procedures (Include proposed data collection and analysis if project is not complete)

5 Results *

<u>Results</u> - Discuss findings within the context of prior research, conceptual framework, and study limitations.

6 Conclusions *

<u>Conclusions</u> - Explain the meaning of findings for the science of nursing.

COMPETITIVE ABSTRACT LITERATURE REVIEW

3 Background *

<u>Problem</u> - Describe the health care issue the review addresses. Provide support for the significance of the problem. <u>Purpose</u> - State the objectives of this inquiry relative to the overall literature review on this topic.

4 Methods *

<u>Search Strategy</u> - Identify databases searched, inclusion/exclusion criteria.

5 Results *

<u>Results of literature search</u> - Describe the search, number of studies included and level of evidence & <u>Synthesis of Evidence</u> - Briefly describe the synthesis of the evidence that includes major trends and notable gaps.

6 Conclusions *

<u>Implications for Practice</u> - Include your recommendations for practice, education, or future research based on the review and synthesis of the literature.





Financial Relationships

Definition of Financial Relationship...

Financial relationships are those relationships in which the individual benefits by receiving a salary, royalty, intellectual property rights, consulting fee, honoraria for promotional speakers' bureau, ownership interest (e.g. stocks, stock options or other ownership interest, excluding diversified mutual funds), or other financial benefit. Financial benefits are usually associated with roles such as employment, owner, management position, independent contractor (including contracted research), consulting, speaking and teaching, membership on advisory committees or review panels, board membership, and other activities from which remuneration is received, or expected. Contracted research includes research funding where the institution gets the grant and manages the fund and the person is the principal or named investigator on the grant. There is no minimum dollar amount for relationships.

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
Definition of Ineligible Company...

An *ineligible company* is any entity producing, marketing, selling, re-selling, or distributing healthcare products or services consumed by, or used on, patients. Providers of clinical service directly to patients are <u>not</u> ineligible companies (unless the provider of clinical service is owned, or controlled, by an ineligible company). The following are <u>not</u> ineligible company:

- · 501-C Non-profit organizations that do not advocate for ineligible companies
- · Government organizations
- Non-health care related companies
- · Liability insurance providers
- · Health insurance providers

This process takes time to complete and you will be required to upload your CV- PLEASE allow yourself enough time.
