**Thereas**, case managers play a critical role in securing medical care and social supports while navigating complex health systems to acquire the resources needed to help individuals thrive; their work strengthens communities, improve health outcomes, and encourages individuals' physical and emotional wellness; and

**Experses**, community-based care managers, including service coordinators, health workers, and patient navigators, support New Yorkers of all ages; resources such as reproductive planning, home visiting during pregnancy and postpartum, early intervention for young children with disabilities, and coordinated care for people with disabilities and chronic conditions are located and utilized by care managers when appropriate for individuals' benefit; and

**Exercise**, this profession is a vital link in our health and human services system and thousands of people have had their lives positively changed by the committed and compassionate care they have received from case managers; and

**Thereas**, Case Management Awareness Week acknowledges case managers, raises public awareness of their duties, and increases recognition of their selfless efforts to secure quality services and interventions for the individuals they assist;
