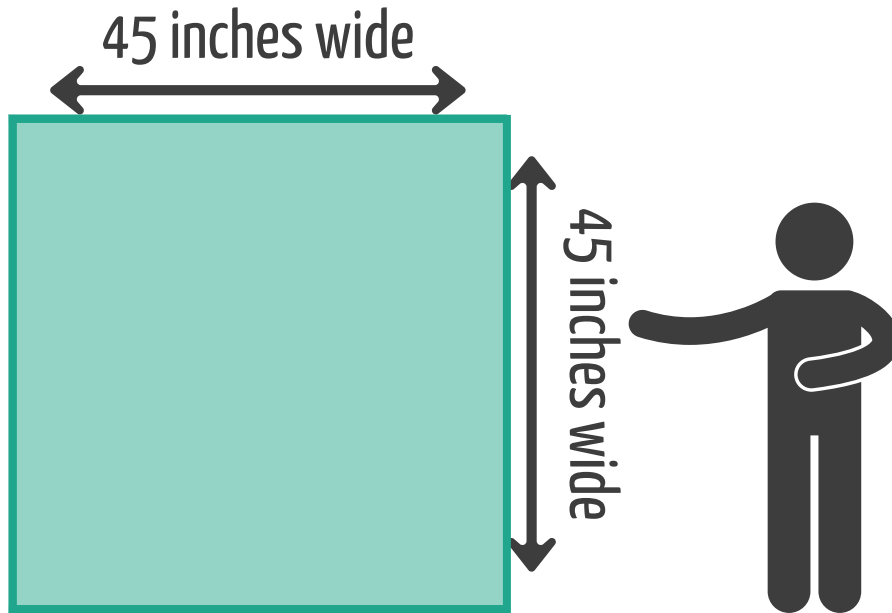

Poster Set-Up/Tear-Down Instructions:

All poster sessions will be in the La Jolla Ballroom.

- **Poster Session I - Tuesday, September 8 from 1:45 PM to 3:15 PM**
 - Set-Up Time: Tuesday, September 8 from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM
 - Tear-Down Time: Tuesday, September 8 from 3:15 PM to 4:15 PM. All posters left behind will be discarded.
- **Poster Session II - Wednesday, September 9 from 1:00 PM to 2:30 PM**
 - Set-Up Time: Wednesday, September 9 from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM
 - Tear-Down Time: Wednesday, September 9 from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM. All posters left behind will be discarded.
- **Poster Session III - Thursday, September 10 from 2:30 PM to 4:00 PM**
 - Set-Up Time: Thursday, September 10 from 9:00 AM to 1:30 PM
 - Tear-Down Time: Thursday, September 10 from 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. All posters left behind will be discarded.

Posters should only be set-up for your assigned poster session. Posters set-up prior to your session's designated time will be removed and potentially discarded.

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General Guidelines:

- Presenters are responsible for printing their own posters.
- Maximum poster size is **45 inches wide by 45 inches tall**.
- Push pins will be provided to mount your poster.
- Posters should be as lightweight as possible. Do not mount materials on a heavy board because it will be difficult to affix the materials to the poster boards.
- Each poster board will be numbered. **Please do not remove the poster numbers.**

Poster Layout Guidelines:

Prepare your poster to communicate the main points of your work to stimulate discussion with your viewers.

- Poster presentations should be simple and to the point. Use a minimum amount of clear text. Avoid jargon.
- Make sure poster is easy to read. Use large, **BOLD** fonts. Text colors should be in high contrast to the background color to ensure legibility for all attendees, including those who may be colorblind or otherwise visually impaired.

- Title and author name(s) should be clearly labeled.
- Please indicate the presenting author in the author block (bold, underline, asterisk, etc.).
- You may bring poster handouts/copies for distribution during your assigned session. Flux will not be able to print any handouts.
- Include section headings to direct reader's attention.
- Catch your reader's attention with accent colors for contrast and to highlight main points.
- Use borders or white space to separate sections and increase legibility.
- Use simple figures (graphs, charts, illustrations, and photographs) to illustrate your point. Make sure to include captions.
- Summarize your results/findings with bullet points.

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
