

5th Occasional Meeting of the NIAAA Working Group on Intervention Development for Alcohol-Related Interpersonal Dynamics: A Collaboration with Georgia State University

In September, 2012, NIAAA hosted a Workshop at NIH entitled “*Toward Effective Interventions for Alcohol-Related Sexual, Physical, and Intimate Partner Violence: Where We Are, What is Needed, How to Get There*”. That meeting was followed up by 3 more meetings of the “Working Group” in 2016, 2018, and 2023, respectively. Hence, 3 years have elapsed since the last such meeting. The next meeting will be held on June 20, 2026 as a Satellite to the RSA Conference.

Like the previous “Occasional” meetings, this one will provide “one-stop shopping” for those students, grant applicants, and interpersonal violence basic behavioral and prevention researchers who are seeking an overview of the full range and depth of the NIAAA sexual and intimate partner violence prevention portfolio.

The Workshop will comprise talks from NIAAA grantees currently engaged in basic behavioral research on the effects of alcohol on interpersonal violence as well as those conducting preventive interventions for alcohol-related sexual assault, intimate partner violence and teen dating violence. Speakers will summarize their research and point out challenges in moving the field forward. A lunch hour poster session will feature NIAAA F and K awardees who have grants in these areas of research.
